From the Desk of the Parish Director

For many of us, Labor Day Weekend signals the end of summer activities, and a final long weekend as school begins in earnest.

For many, however, this weekend calls to mind their own reality around labor. As of May 2008, 4.4% of Wisconsin residents were unemployed. One of the main causes of unemployment is a lack of good jobs meaning livable wages and health benefits. Because of this lack of good jobs, there has also been an increase in the number of people who find themselves homeless. As the poverty rates increase, we see an overwhelming number of people who are finding themselves one paycheck, one illness or one accident away from being homeless.

The cycle of less good jobs which leads to poverty and homelessness is even more detrimental to school age children who face additional obstacles when trying to get a good education. More than 13,000 children are classified as homeless in Milwaukee alone.

These statistics are sobering. Let us not close our eyes to such realities.

I would like to share with you a prayer developed by the Cincinnati Interfaith Committee for Worker Justice:

God our Creator, we are the work of Your hands. Guide us in our work, that we may do it, not for self alone but for the common good. Make us alert to injustice, ready to stand in solidarity that there may be dignity for all in labor and in labor's reward.

Almighty God, source of all life and creativity, You have given each person unique abilities which can contribute to the common good. On this day honoring labor, guide each of us to work in Your own Spirit for the fulfillment of community and justice.

God of history, You created humankind in Your own image to be fruitful and carry on the work of Your hands. Help us each day that we labor to bring Your Spirit to all that we do. May Your own justice spread throughout the economies of the world.

On this Labor Day, we pray for all workers and employers that the workplace be guided by the principles of human dignity and economic justice. We pray also that God's Spirit will guide all those who make decisions about our economy—that concerns for justice and the common good will shape our national priorities.


