From the Desk of the Parish Director

The 2008-2009 Parish Support Commitment begins this weekend. For St. Therese to be a strong parish, everyone's time, talent and treasure are needed. What will be your contribution? The material you receive this weekend provides opportunities for everyone to become involved.

Enclosed in this week's bulletin is the financial statement for the fiscal year ending June 30th. The fact that there was not a deficit for the fiscal year 2007-2008 is due, I believe, to the careful planning and overseeing by the Finance/Administration Committee, and particularly by Dr. Guliano. They are to be commended for their diligence to be fiscally responsible.

However, in reviewing the financial statement, it is my opinion that St. Therese is not financially sound. My definition for being financially sound is that the ordinary operating expenses of a parish are covered by the weekly envelopes and offertory collection. Excluding capital expenses, the short-fall from weekly envelopes/offertory collection was almost \$130,000. St. Therese Parish is dependent on extra donations, memorials/bequests, rental income, investment interest, and fundraisers to operate. We cannot always depend on these sources. In addition, the over \$24,000 in capital expenses that was taken from investments has not been replaced.

I do not believe the picture has to be so grim. Are you aware that each of us has varying gifts, including financial resources, and that it is our responsibility to share out of our abundance, not out of our surplus? I encourage you to review your financial income, and using the chart enclosed with your Parish Support Commitment to see how generous is your financial offering. If you tithe (5% of your income to church; 5% to other charities), you will always have enough. That is the miracle that comes with a generous heart. Be a generous steward of your resources. See what a difference it makes in your own life and in the life of St. Therese Parish.
