From the Desk of the Parish Director

- ◆ Thanks to all who made last weekend's celebration of our patronal feast, The Feast of St. Therese so enjoyable. Special gratitude to those who set up, prepared food, and cleaned up for the hospitality and receptions after all the masses. I certainly felt "welcomed home!"
- ◆ Our Finance/Administration Committee and Parish Council began our Parish Support Commitment in early September. As of September 21st, 198 parish members responded and committed a total of \$221,504 for the support of our parish and its ministries. Since then, more parish members have responded, and an up-to-date report will be given in upcoming bulletins.
- ◆ A decision that our Parish Council will be making at its November 2nd meeting is whether to sponsor a festival for 2009. In the past several years, our proceeds have diminished. The Parish Council has been exploring other fundraising options to supplement our collections and donations. If you would like to express and submit your thoughts regarding whether or not the parish should sponsor a festival for 2009, please call a Parish Council member (listed in the bulletin) to speak with them and summarize your comments in writing. Kindly submit these comments to any Parish Council member, and these will be reviewed at a special Listening Session on Sunday, November 2nd in Miriam's Corner, after the 10:00AM mass. The November 2nd meeting will begin with an Open-to-All listening session (open to all parish members), after which the Parish Council will deliberate to make the final decision.

Decisions like this one are never easy ones to make. Suffice it to say, however, that the Parish Council has the best interests of St. Therese Parish Community at heart.

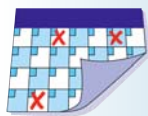
Did You Know?

This Weekend is Sharing Weekend

The Recipient of the collection is Repairers of the Breach. The facility is located on the near west side of Milwaukee and cares for homeless. The Repairers provides more than 55 services and program opportunities all designed to bring the homeless people into mainstreamed, contributing lifestyles. During last February it became a 24-hour warming room, perhaps preventing the deaths of approximately 100 people as a result of the life threatening cold. In September, they began a free medical clinic in collaboration with MSOE School of Nursing. Your support will continue to produce "good fruit" in the form of successes among the homeless. They are deeply appreciative of our financial and prayer support.
