From the Desk of the Parish Director

The Archdiocesan Capital Campaign process has begun for our parish. On Tuesday, November 18th, Mari Pavleje, Trustee-Secretary; Jim Balliet, Trustee-Treasurer; Barb Heinz, Courtney Falk, Cathy Smith, and I met with Mark Filips, the consultant from the firm of O'Meara Ferguson, assigned to our parish. O'Meara Ferguson is the fundraising firm that the Archdiocese of Milwaukee has hired for the Capital Campaign. While it was an introductory meeting, it certainly was the first step for our parish's participation.

On Tuesday evening, November 18th, Kathy Hubrich, Janet Krebs, Cathy Smith, and I attended another meeting regarding the Capital Campaign at St. Mary Parish in Lomira to learn about how to draft our "case statement" for our parish campaign.

Faith In Our Future is the title of the campaign adopted by the archdiocese. It contains two components—funding for parishes and funding for archdiocesan ministries.

60% of all money donated go to the individual parish; 40% will go to the archdiocese for support of several ministries—faith formation at all levels, including a Catholic education endowment; adult and family formation; and stewardship to the global church.

Our Parish Council and Finance/Administration Committee have been preparing for this campaign since it first started in our archdiocese in the fall of 2007. The archdiocesan goal is \$105 million dollars. As of June 20th, over \$30 million dollars has been pledged by advanced gifts and 37 of the 211 archdiocesan parishes.

A separate corporation has been established, the *Faith In Our Future* Trust Fund. It is (1) separate from the Archdiocese of Milwaukee operating funds; (2) founded to benefit Catholic formation, education, and faith formation in southeastern Wisconsin; and (3) presided over by the archbishop and a lay board.

None of the funds collected for the Faith In Our Future Trust Fund will be used for litigation costs and settlements resulting from the sexual abuse by priests. The Faith In Our Future Trust Fund is restricted for any other use than specified; therefore, none of the money can be used for lawsuits.

The Parish Council will be discussing our parish Capital Campaign at its December 1st meeting, and the Finance/Administration Committee will be doing the same at its December 2nd meeting. Both

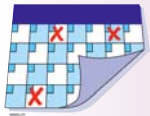

First Sunday of Advent

One of my favorite sayings is, “Be the kind of person your dog thinks you are!” Our family has a history of saving dogs from shelters and other certain fates; every single one of them has been the most loyal, friendly, and loving pet. Our latest, Oreo, was found in a barn on a freezing January morning. Only a pup and suffering from frostbite and injuries from other animals, she wasn’t given much chance of survival. But twelve years later, she sits and waits by the front door every afternoon for her master to come home.



“Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come.” Jesus’ seemingly stern warning in today’s Gospel reading from Mark is really some very prudent advice. Remember that this was not a sermon to a mass of people; Jesus was speaking privately to Peter, James, John, and Andrew and had just finished describing how humankind will recognize the beginning of the end of times. But his final words tell us not to wait until such signs are apparent; today, and every day, we are to live our lives in great expectation. Be the kind of person our heavenly Father thinks we are!

This is the first Sunday of the season of Advent. During this season, we remember God’s first covenant, the centuries of time in which he promised a Messiah, a Savior for the world. And despite the centuries and passing of time, those who believed and waited never lost faith. The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us that in Advent we share the expectations of those who first waited, and renew our expectation for his second coming (CCC 524). Today and for the rest of our lives, let us live forever in a season of Advent, awaiting the coming of Jesus Christ.
