From the Desk of the Parish Director

Thanks to the approximately 100 people who attended the Annual Meeting on Sunday, May 2nd. Several important issues were discussed and resolutions passed. Among these were the following:

- ◆ Election of Kathy Hubrich as Trustee-Secretary, effective July 1st, 2010 through June 30th, 2011.
- ◆ Thanks expressed to Mari Pavleje for serving as Trustee-Secretary for the last five years (2005–2010.)
- ◆ Acceptance of the Committee/Group Reports with one correction to the Finance/Administration Committee report (the check for “World Mission” was for \$250 rather than \$6200)
- ◆ Review of the 2010-2011 Parish Operating Budget with explanations and comments by Jim Balliet, Trustee-Treasurer
- ◆ Update on our Faith In Our Future Capital Campaign by Michael Falk, Chairperson
- ◆ Approval of Revision to the Parish Council By-Laws
- ◆ Explanation of the new computer-generated Liturgical Ministry Schedule by Mari Pavleje
- ◆ A preliminary discussion of the need for a change of Sunday mass times in order to support our parish commitment to whole community catechesis

As mentioned above, there is a need for a change of our Sunday morning mass schedule. Currently, we do not have enough time between our two Sunday masses to accommodate our catechesis process for children and adults. We need to schedule more time between the two masses. As it is now, catechesis for both children and parents begins at 8:45AM and often ends after 10:00AM. This makes it difficult for families to attend either of our Sunday liturgies and also does not make it possible for either Father Hugh, Father Norm, or I to participate in the catechetical sessions. Assuming mass takes about an hour, we need a minimum of 90 minutes (an hour and a half) from the end of one mass to the beginning of the next, to adequately satisfy our catechetical needs. (Another way of considering this is that there needs to be two and a half hours between the start of each mass. Currently, we have only two hours between the start of each mass.)

It is important to note that, over four years ago, our parish made a commitment to lifelong faith formation through **whole-community catechesis**. That means that the entire faith community is involved in catechesis, not just those who volunteer to be catechists for groups of children, youth, or adults. While this emphasis is a change from the days of “CCD classes” and “memorizing the catechism,” it is one that has the potential to enliven, deepen, and expand our faith community. But it is not an easy change...shifting from classes held apart from the Sunday Eucharist and from the whole community to faith formation involving the entire community and centered on the weekly celebration of Eucharist.

I emphasized at the Annual Meeting that our challenge here at St. Therese is to view ourselves as one community, not three communities who gather at 5:00PM Saturday, 8:00AM Sunday, and 10:00AM Sunday. No matter what mass time you prefer, you are part of one community that is St. Therese Parish.

I am also poignantly aware that any change, and particularly a change of mass times, can bring out tensions and anxieties. Some decide to leave parishes based on change. But it is also true that others join or become active because of change. It is important to remember that, throughout our short 54-year history as a parish here on Bluemound Rd, there have been changes, and we came through these with God’s grace.

The Parish Council will meet with the Christian Formation Committee on Monday, May 17th at 6:30PM to discuss our catechetical needs and how to best achieve that two and a half hour time between the start of our two Sunday masses. **If you have any input whatsoever on this issue, please submit it in writing to any member of the Parish Council (names and email address in this bulletin).** The Council hopes to make a recommendation on mass schedule times by June 30th.

Let us continue to pray for our parish and for the guidance of the Holy Spirit on our lives together. Come Holy Spirit!

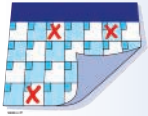

St. Therese Faith In Our Future Capital Campaign Update

As of April 27th, our parish has received a total of \$50,185.26 from the FIOF Trust Fund for our parish projects. The last transfer we received (on April 27th) was for \$1512. With this money, we have been able to update our heating system, make needed repairs to our heating system, purchase and install a new water heater, install a new threshold on the Bell Tower door, complete the indoor ramp in church, and tithe to our parish St. Vincent de Paul Society and Greater Tosa Interfaith. In addition, the Finance/Administration Committee approved the disbursement of \$250 of FIOF funds to support the archdiocesan youth mission trip to Nicaragua. Sahar Safavi, of our parish community, will be participating in that mission trip. Thanks to all who continue to support our parish capital campaign, Faith In our Future. Our next effort is to save for our lighting update in church and throughout our building.

Bats in the Belfry

Spring is upon us and with that comes the occasional bat in the Church. Here are some guidelines to follow if you come upon a bat:

- ♦ **If you see a bat, leave it where it is.** If it is in an office or a meeting room, it is better to move the meeting than the bat. They use sonar, so they do not respond to an open door because their eyesight is too poor to recognize it as a way out. Lock it in the room if you can, hang a sign on the door to alert others not to enter, and contact the maintenance department immediately. If no one from maintenance is in the building, please have any staff member contact them immediately. Do not simply leave a note, as swift removal is essential for both us and them.
- ♦ **Do not attempt to catch or kill.** Bats are not aggressive, but will bite if handled.
- ♦ **Do not panic**—it will make them more excited. Most collisions happen because we move into their path as they are trying to avoid us.
- ♦ If you see one on the ground it is most likely ill. **Do not go near it.** So, again, if you see a bat in the building, call the maintenance department immediately. We have the proper equipment and procedures to deal with them. The goal is to catch and release quickly and safely.

Christian Formation Committee to Host Parish Council

On Monday, May 17th the Christian Formation Committee will host members of the Parish Council to discuss the life of Catechetics and Faith Formation at St. Therese. The meeting will look at where St. Therese has been and set a course for the future of Lifelong Faith Formation.

St. Therese is a community committed to Whole Parish Catechesis. The catechetical curriculum at St. Therese is an attempt to follow the directives given to the Church following the Second Vatican Council. In the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) we are told, "Catechesis is intimately bound up with the whole of the Church's life." Catechesis or religious instruction is multifaceted. These facets include liturgy, moral instruction, prayer, education for community life, understanding ecumenical and interfaith dialogues, and most importantly, a true, deep conversion and transformation to Jesus.

All catechesis needs to be tightly connected to the Sunday assembly for Mass. When we spend time as community hearing the Word and sharing ourselves with one another we are more open to conversion. As individuals when we share we are more aware of Christ present in our lives and touching us more deeply.

Faith formation needs to be lifelong in nature because the facets of catechesis are changed as we gain life experience and wisdom. By working on our understandings we will grow closer to Christ and our brothers and sisters in faith. When we work on our faith we also have the ability to be a witness to Christ for those around us.
