

From the Desk of the Parish Director

Over the past year, our Human Concerns Committee has discussed the need to form a parish policy regarding petitions. Within the past year, several groups have requested being able to put out petitions for those attending mass to sign. This resulted in the need to establish a parish policy.

After many discussions and much deliberation, the Human Concerns Committee of St. Therese created and unanimously passed a policy regarding the placement of petitions at our parish. The committee made this decision fully aware that other parishes do allow petitions. While the Human Concerns Committee recognized the effectiveness of this form of advocacy, the group felt that signing petitions in a venue other than the parish would be the best current course for our parish community.

As Catholics, we are called to live the Gospel and to embrace Catholic Social Teaching. The Human Concerns Committee remains committed to discerning how our parish community can be faithful to the Gospel and Catholic Social Teaching, and, at the same time, honor the diversity of ways this can be accomplished.

The Human Concerns Committee is charged with overseeing and supporting all our parish efforts for direct service to those in need, outreach, education for justice and peace, and advocacy. The groups/ministries that are a part of Human Concerns include St. Vincent de Paul Society, St. Vincent de Paul Meal Program, Respect Life, Little Flower Ministries, Greater Tosa Interfaith, Sharing Sunday, Green Team, Advent/Lenten Giving, and events like Mission Sunday. Currently, the committee meets quarterly. Membership is open to all parishioners, and the group welcomes new members. If you are interested in serving on this Committee, please contact Alice Kennedy, Chairperson.

Let us continue to support each other in our Lenten journey.
