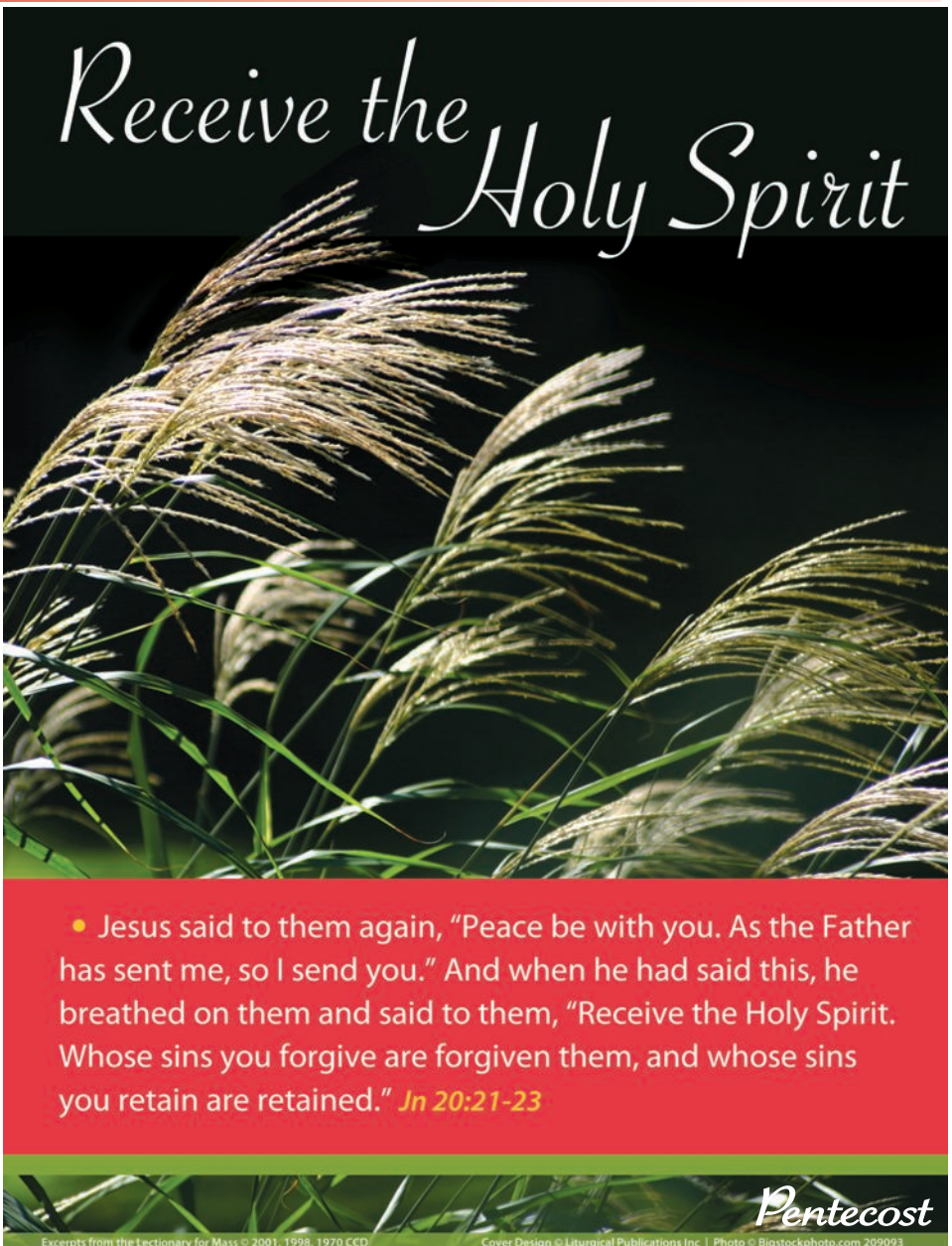

♦ Look at all the red today! It's the Solemnity of Pentecost! It is the day we commemorate that the Holy Spirit descended upon Mary and the apostles, strengthening them to carry on Christ's work in the world. Jesus was no longer physically with them to direct them. Now they had the power of the Holy Spirit to guide them.

The Holy Spirit is given to us much more subtly than to those in the Upper Room that first Pentecost. We do not receive the Spirit with tongues of fire, but at our Baptism, we were filled with the Holy Spirit. If we are open, the Holy Spirit comes to us every day in so many ways... through the sacraments, through prayer, through the ordinary events of every day, through nature, through conversations with others, and more.

Attention: Eucharistic Ministers



- ♦ During the month of June, all Eucharistic Ministers are asked to meet in the sacristy 15 minutes before mass to review the Eucharistic Minister ministry. Please also note that the bags of hosts have 500 to a bag. Please follow the directions for setting up the credence table and kindly count the number of hosts to be placed in the communion plate to be consecrated at mass. Counting the number of hosts for the plate will help resolve the problem of overloading the ciborium.
- ♦ Eucharistic Ministers that are scheduled for 10:30AM Mass during the summer, please note that there are five ministers scheduled rather than the usual seven. Please follow the directions in the sacristy and set-up for mass accordingly. Carefully note your positions at the altar and for distribution of communion. Eucharistic Ministers assigned to positions #1 and #2 have special duties (setting up the credence and gift tables, and making sure that a full complement of ministers is checked in by 5 minutes before mass when we begin the prayer in the sacristy), so please arrive no later than ten minutes before mass begins.
- ♦ We have been experiencing problems with "no shows" for assigned ministry times. If you are unable to serve at an assigned mass, please arrange for a substitute. A roster of all Eucharistic Ministers and their contact information is available in the Eucharistic Ministry box in the sacristy. Thank you for your cooperation on this very important ministry.

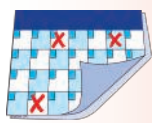

Question on the Roman Missal, Third Edition

Why is there a need for a new translation?

Pope John Paul II issued the third edition of the Missale Romanum (the Latin text of the Roman Missal) during the Jubilee Year in 2000. This new edition included many new texts requiring translation. In addition, the experience of the years after the Second Vatican Council gave rise to a desire for more formal and literal translations of the original Latin texts. This new translation will employ the best of what we have learned about translation and liturgical language in two generations of celebrating the Liturgy in the vernacular. It will provide an opportunity to reflect ever more deeply on the Eucharistic celebration that lies at the heart of the Church's life.

Parish Forms

The Human Concerns Ad Hoc Committee will immediately review the request and send it on to the Finance/Administration Committee and Dr. Guliano for approval. Please note that any collection of money or goods, or the sale of any goods is considered a fundraiser and requires the approval of Finance/Administration Committee per archdiocesan and parish policy. Also, since we receive many requests to collect items for groups, we want to ensure that these are reviewed appropriately.
