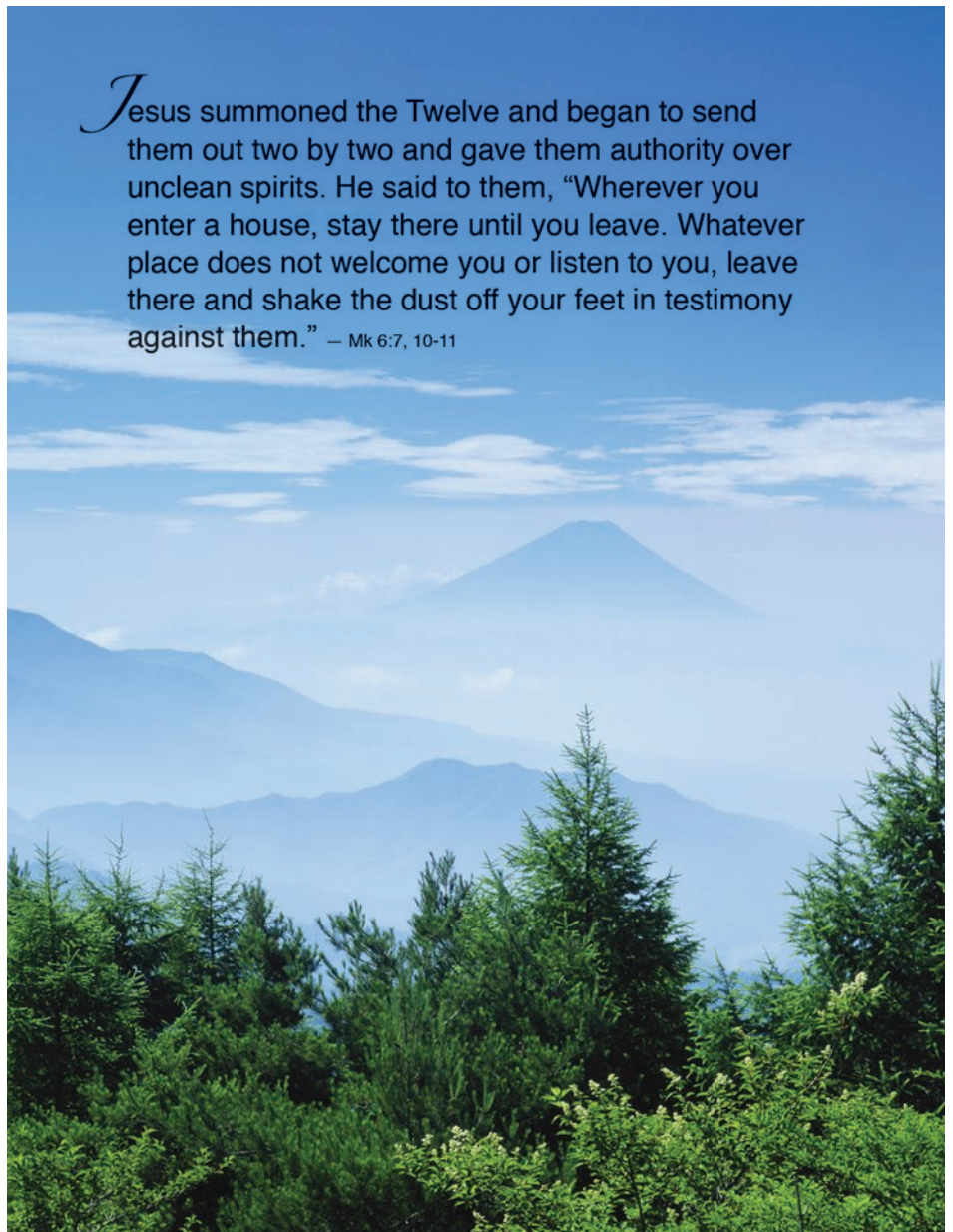

Our deepest appreciation goes to the seven help-out priests who have joined us and will continue to celebrate the Eucharist with us. Most especially, thanks to Father Norm Oswald, who has added the two weekday masses to his schedule—6:30PM on Wednesdays and 7:30AM on Fridays. It is this type of generosity that is part of our “living the Little Way.”
- ◆ Before Father Hugh knew about his need for cardiac surgery, he was a part of the decision regarding the mass schedule—to return to three masses on the weekend beginning September 1st. 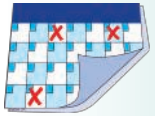

## Proclaiming Christ to a Secular Culture

Rev. Robert Barron, STD, recently named rector and president of the University of St. Mary on the Lake/Mundelein Seminary, will present the 2012 Pallium Lecture, "Proclaiming Christ to a Secular Culture." Fr. Barron is the writer and host of *CATHOLICISM*, a ground breaking, 10-part documentary series about the Catholic faith and founder of Word on Fire ([www.WordOnFire.org](http://www.WordOnFire.org)).
