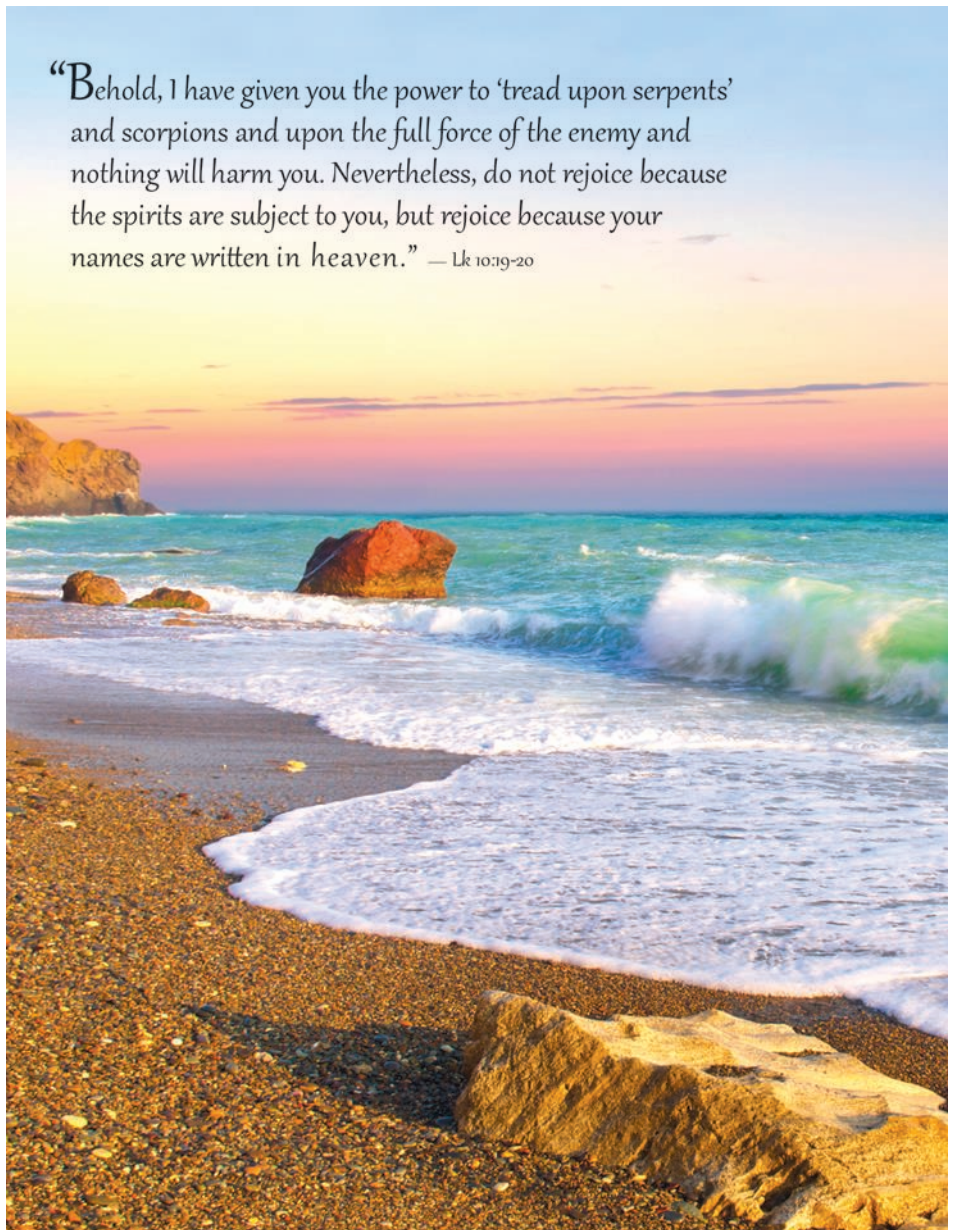

From the Desk of the Parish Director

We spent time in February at our All Parish Meeting and at the Annual Parish Meeting in May reviewing the Parishes and Pastoral Leadership 2020 document. There has been some question about the purpose of the Archdiocesan Synod, since the "2020 document" was the planning document guiding the archdiocese.

The Synod is meant to be a more "grassroots" gathering of the faithful who represent the parishes and institutions of the archdiocese. The 2020 document focused primarily on pastoral leadership (availability of priests and models of parishes). The Synod is meant to surface initiatives and future visions.

Hopefully, the Synod will be an opportunity for our parishes to voice our concerns regarding our parishes, to articulate our hopes and dreams, to envision what our future as parishes in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee could be. It will also be a chance for us to listen to others and hear what their concerns, hopes, dreams, and visions are.

One of the main descriptions of the Church in the documents of Vatican II is the statement: The Church is the People of God. *Gaudium et Spes*. That's us. We are the Church.

Hopefully, the Synod will be time to ask questions as well.

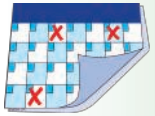
Archdiocesan Synod Announced: June 7th-8th, 2014

Archbishop Listecki has announced that an Archdiocesan Synod will be held Pentecost weekend, June 7th-8th, 2014. A Synod, simply put, is an assembly where the faithful deliberate on the pastoral needs of the diocese. The Synod will gather people from the entire Catholic community including priests, parish directors, deacons, lay parish leadership, religious communities and parishioners.

The hope of the Synod will be to re-energize Catholics in their faith and inspire a new evangelization within the Church of southeastern Wisconsin. The Synod will provide the faith community the opportunity to develop a renewed vision of how we work together in implementing our pastoral priorities of Catholic Identity, Evangelization and Stewardship.

Archbishop Listecki's recently released Pastoral Letter on the Church, *Who Do You Say That I Am?*, is the foundation from which the Synod planning will occur. Parishes are being asked to hold dialogue sessions in October and November for all parishioners. These sessions will be rooted in the Pastoral Letter and will give parishioners an opportunity to provide input on pastoral goals and future initiatives for the archdiocese.

The Synod and the sessions leading up to it should be a wonderful and exciting spirit-led process that will give the archdiocese a clearer direction of priorities for the next 10 years. Zoo Interchange Project Update

Thank you Richard Hopefl of our Parish Council, who represented our parish at the Zoo Interchange Project meetings on June 16th and 20th. Following is a summary he prepared for the Council and our parish community:

- Potter Road @ Hwy 100—Closed from June 15th to July 15th
- Greenfield Ave. Bridge—Open July 19th (freeway ramps later)
- Bluemound Rd.—Traffic switched to south side (two lanes each direction) June 27th for north side lane work
- Bluemound Rd. @ Hwy 100—Closed July 20th to 31st
 - Bluemound Rd. closed along west side of Hwy 100
 - Bluemound through traffic from west routed to Mt. Vernon and Potter Roads
 - Hwy 100 open on east side (two lanes north and south)
- Bluemound Rd. completed August 1st
- Watertown Plank Rd. @ Hwy 100—Closed August 1st to 10th

Collection/Requests for Donations of Money or Goods Needs Finance Council Approval

The Finance Council of the parish is charged with monitoring all the money and goods that the parish (and committees, ministries, or outside groups) receives, requests, or spends. Because of this, the Finance Council has an approval process, which applies to all parish groups and committees who wish to ask for donations or gifts of goods for their ministries. Since the parish receives many requests for voluntary donations, collections, and commodities collections in addition to those mandated by the archdiocese, the Finance Council must review each request for the good of the parish and the recipients of the money and/or goods.

Each Finance Council meeting agenda includes a review of requests made within the past 60 days of the meeting. The Special Event (With or Without Fundraising) Form is reviewed and a determination is made. Janet Krebs, secretary of the Council, or another member of the Finance Council, calls the contact person after the meeting to relay the decision.

Typically, the Finance Council gets two to three requests per month from parish groups and parishioners alone. The Council has to balance these requests with our monthly Sharing Sunday, the Archdiocesan Combined Collections, the ongoing Catholic Stewardship Appeal, our own special needs, and our weekly collection.

The Finance Council thanks all our committees, groups, and ministries for doing their best to adhere to our parish policy regarding requests for money or goods. Let's do all we can to minister together for the good of all concerned.
