

From the Desk of the Parish Director

◆ Lent begins this Wednesday, February 25th with the celebration of Ash Wednesday. We begin forty days of preparation for Easter with the visual reminder of our destiny beyond our human life—the ashes that are imposed on our foreheads. We hear the call to repentance and to deeper faith through the words, “Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel.”

In the early Church, Ash Wednesday marked the day when public penitents would come to the church in the penitential garments of sackcloth to be sprinkled with ashes. They then would be sent from the assembly to begin their penance for 40 days and would return to the church on Holy Thursday, when they would again be united with the assembly around the Tables of Word and Sacrament and receive the Eucharist. Over the centuries, the practice of dismissing the penitents, was dropped, but the imposition of ashes remained and was expanded to include all the faithful who come forward to receive them.

These forty days are a gift to us. Some writers refer to these days as our yearly retreat, our yearly time to focus on what is most essential in our lives and to let go of what keeps us distracted from God. It is a time when truly “less is more.” We are asked to embark on a journey that can expand our soul if we immerse ourselves in the spirituality of Lent.

Thanks to the generosity of Father Hugh, we will be celebrating a Wednesday evening mass at 6:15PM in the Chapel. Liturgical ministers are needed for these masses, as well as a sacristan to prepare and cleanse the sacred vessels afterward. If you can help, please sign up in the sacristy.

◆ During the Season of Lent, we also will continue our preparations for our St. Therese Faith In Our Future Capital Campaign. While the actual commitment weekends are in May, there are several activities that will be held as we lead up to Commitment Sunday. We already have the following committees formed and operating as leadership teams: Chairpersons, Prayer, Administration, Contact, Information, Children and Youth Activities, and Special Events. There will be more information in future bulletins regarding these committees and how you can be a part of the Capital Campaign.

◆ Thanks to Ann Maher, Jesse Stringer, Darian Borst, and Michael Falk for serving as our Parish Chairpersons for our St. Therese Faith In Our Future Capital Campaign. They will be addressing us at mass soon.


Pause and reflect on what this Lenten season is all about growing in holiness. Allow the grace of God to flow through you, in your heart and your conscience.

Lent Begins on Wednesday, February 25th

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 25th. Two liturgies with the distribution of ashes will be celebrated at 8:00AM and 7:00PM in the church. Liturgical ministers are needed for these masses. Altar servers, Eucharistic ministers, lectors, and greeters are asked to sign up in the sacristy.



Please also note that the Parish Office will be closed on Wednesday in observance of the Holyday.

Lenten Fast and Abstinence


The Catholic Church asks each member to preserve the penitential character and purpose of Lent. For this reason:

1. Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and each Friday of Lent.
2. Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, in addition to abstaining from meat, should fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Hence, on those days they should eat only one full meal. Smaller quantities of food may be taken at two other meals, but no food should be consumed at other times during those two days. The obligation of fasting ceases with the celebration of one's 59th birthday.

Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal penitential practices.

New Ramp for South Church Seating Section

In the past eight months, three of our parish members have fallen on the steps leading from the St. Therese Shrine area to the south section of the church. To offer an alternative to the steps, a ramp with two railings are being constructed so that those who have trouble walking or walk with assistance can access that section of the church safely. Construction has begun and the project should be completed within a few weeks. The cost for the project is approximately \$1000. If you would like to donate for the cost of this project, please contact Dr. Guliano.
