From the Desk of the Parish Director

The Parish Council is in the process of reorganizing and revitalizing our Prayer and Worship Committee, one of the four standing committees of the Parish Council. Along with Finance/Administration, Social Concerns, and Christian Formation, the Prayer & Worship Committee assures that our parish community engages in the essential ministries for Catholic communities in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee.

Over the past years, our parish committees have become ministry committees; that is, working committees. There is a tendency in parishes for committees to be satisfied with being “discussion groups or advisory groups.” Not so at St. Therese. While there is a place for discussion and advice-giving, our committees need to be ministry-focused.

A current challenge that both the Parish Council and Prayer & Worship Committee are (and will be) working on is recruitment of liturgical ministers so that we can continue to offer our three mass times on a weekend. At the recent September 28th Lector and Eucharistic Minister meeting, the following was proposed to expand and bolster our liturgical ministries: ministers offered to volunteer for serving at other masses in addition to their “preferred time;” ministers offered to recruit other parish members for training as Lectors and Eucharistic Ministers; and ministers committed to checking in the sacristy before mass to offer to serve as needed. As with any plans and proposals, the proof is in the follow-through. We all know that it is one thing to talk about something, but it's quite another to do what was talked about. We also need Altar Servers, Lectors, and Ushers, particularly at the 5:00PM and 8:00AM masses.

Our parish is blessed with two priests who want to minister with us—Father Hugh Birdsall, SDS, our Assisting Priest, and Father Norm Oswald, our Help-Out Priest. But, as the sign in church reminds, it takes more than a priest to have a celebration of the Eucharist. I have mentioned several times that, in a time when there is a dire shortage of ordained priests available for the sacraments, we have a unique opportunity to do something different here at St. Therese. We have the chance to continue to reach out to not only our parish members but also the many visitors who grace our parish each weekend due to the excellent and convenient location and accessibility of our church by offering three options for weekend worship.

Will we respond to the opportunity before us? Or, for lack of response to the call to ministry, will we

Next Weekend is Sharing Weekend

The sharing recipient for the month of October will be the Congregation of the Great Spirit. This is a Catholic Native American parish within the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. They incorporate their Native American ways into their Catholic service. They were established in 1989, held Mass service in various borrowed locations. Until July of 1997, they settled into the old St. Gabriel's parish building on 10th and Lapham. They also operate the Siggenauk Center which houses a food and clothing bank. This December they are celebrating their 20th anniversary along with the winter solstice celebration.

The Congregation of the Great Spirit participates in and sponsors many cultural events. They provide a well-balanced blend of Catholic Religious Doctrine and traditional Native American Spirituality to urban Native American children, adult, and elder communities.

They teach others as the Native American culture teaches them that we are all related and as a result, we must live in harmony as co-inhabitants of the world, living in cooperation with nature.

They hope to stay afloat as a parish continually looking for funding. If the Congregation of the Great Spirit loses its Native American identity, then these spiritual and educational opportunities might disappear. Though operating the Center with only three paid employees and twelve volunteers, they average 400 clients a month, and 15-20 new clients to the food pantry. Last fiscal year we had 4568 clients. The clothing bank services 500 clients a year. Please be generous with this parish as their financial problems greatly exceed ours.

Christian Formation News

It has been a couple of weeks since the Christian Formation program had its kick-off. By now, you may have noticed something a little unusual. Our young St. Therese parishioners are asking for signatures following mass. "What is this all about," you ask? Attending mass, participating in Liturgy of the Word and receiving Eucharist is the "source and summit" of Catholic Christian life. Receiving the "Body of Christ" and being the "Body of Christ" in community is very important to forming and catechizing all of us. Asking for a signature from one of the ministers is a wonderful way for these students to more actively participate in the entire mass experience as well as make a personal connection with someone in the parish they may not know. On Catechetical Sunday we were told we are all catechists. The personal interaction you have with a young person at mass is an opportunity for you to do so. So, if you are ministering at mass and asked to sign a child or youth book, here is your chance to make a difference in the life of the young person standing next to you.
