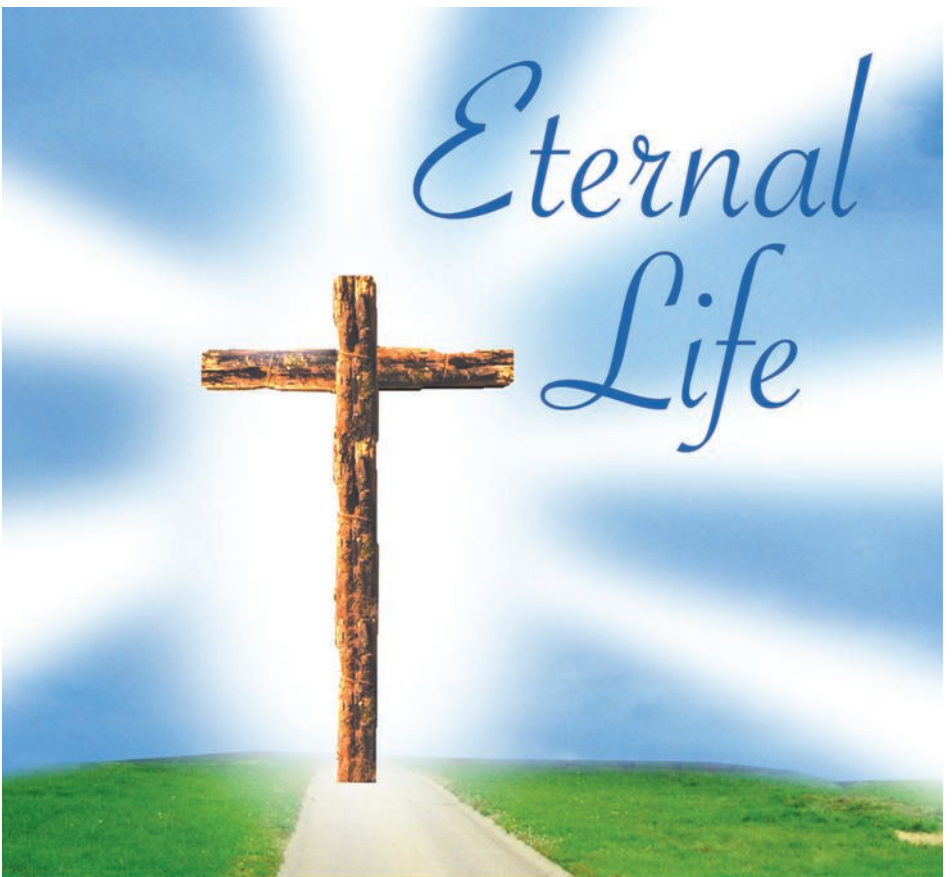

From the Desk of the Parish Director:

- ♦ Happy Father's Day to all our fathers, godfathers, uncles, step-fathers, grandfathers and all men who nurture and care for children of any age. May God guide and bless you this day and always. May St. Joseph, patron of fathers, inspire you!
- ♦ Liturgically speaking, this weekend we celebrate Trinity Sunday or the Most Holy Trinity--Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The Easter Season is behind us, and we are gradually returning to Ordinary Time.

Between Pentecost and Ordinary Time, we have two feasts--The Most Holy Trinity and The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi).

We wear white again for these feasts before we change the colors to summer green.

As a Church, we have been celebrating the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity since the seventh century. The mystery of the Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith. Theologian Catherine LaCugna describes the Trinity as "God for us as Creator, Redeemer, and Sanctifying Spirit."

The Trinity is so important that we begin and end our prayers invoking the Trinity. Our beloved prayer, The Sign of the Cross, is simply an invocation of the Trinity to Whom we address our prayer: "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

Our children who participate in the Children's Liturgy of the Word are learning how to make the Sign of the Cross and are reminded that we begin and end mass with this prayer.

May our Triune God bless, protect, and sustain you!

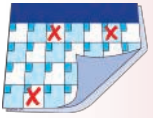

Next Week is Sharing Sunday

The recipient of this month's Sharing is Works of Mercy Summer Camp. This camp provides persons with developmental disabilities a week's vacation in a controlled setting with regularly scheduled events and activities as well as providing volunteers with an opportunity to learn about the needs of persons with disabilities.

Campers are paired with volunteer counselors. Together, they experience camp activities that include arts and crafts, nature hikes, outdoor recreational games, music, talent shows, and movies. Each day also includes time for the celebration of the Eucharist and prayer or reflection on themes such as honesty, trust, thankfulness, and hope.

Works of Mercy Summer Camp was founded in 1975 by CYO Director, Fr. John Endejan and is held at the Archbishop Cousins Catholic Center in Milwaukee. We ask for your generosity for this ministry.

Question on the Roman Missal, Third Edition

Who is doing the work of translation?

The process of translating liturgical texts from the original Latin is a highly consultative work done by several groups. The International Commission on English in the Liturgy (ICEL) prepares English translations of liturgical texts on behalf of the conferences of bishops of English-speaking countries. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) and the other member conferences receive draft translations of each text and have the opportunity to offer comments and suggestions to ICEL. Then ICEL proposes a second draft, which each conference approves and submits to the Vatican for final approval. Each conference reserves the right to amend or modify a particular text.

At the Vatican, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments examines the translated texts, offers authoritative approval (recognitio) of the texts, and grants permission for their use. Currently the Congregation is aided by the recommendations of Vox Clara, a special committee of bishops and consultants from English-speaking countries. The translation and review process is guided by the guidelines in *Liturgiam Authenticam*, issued in 2001, an instruction from the Congregation that outlines the principles and rules for liturgical translation. In 2007, the Congregation also issued a ratio outlining the specific rules for translation in English.

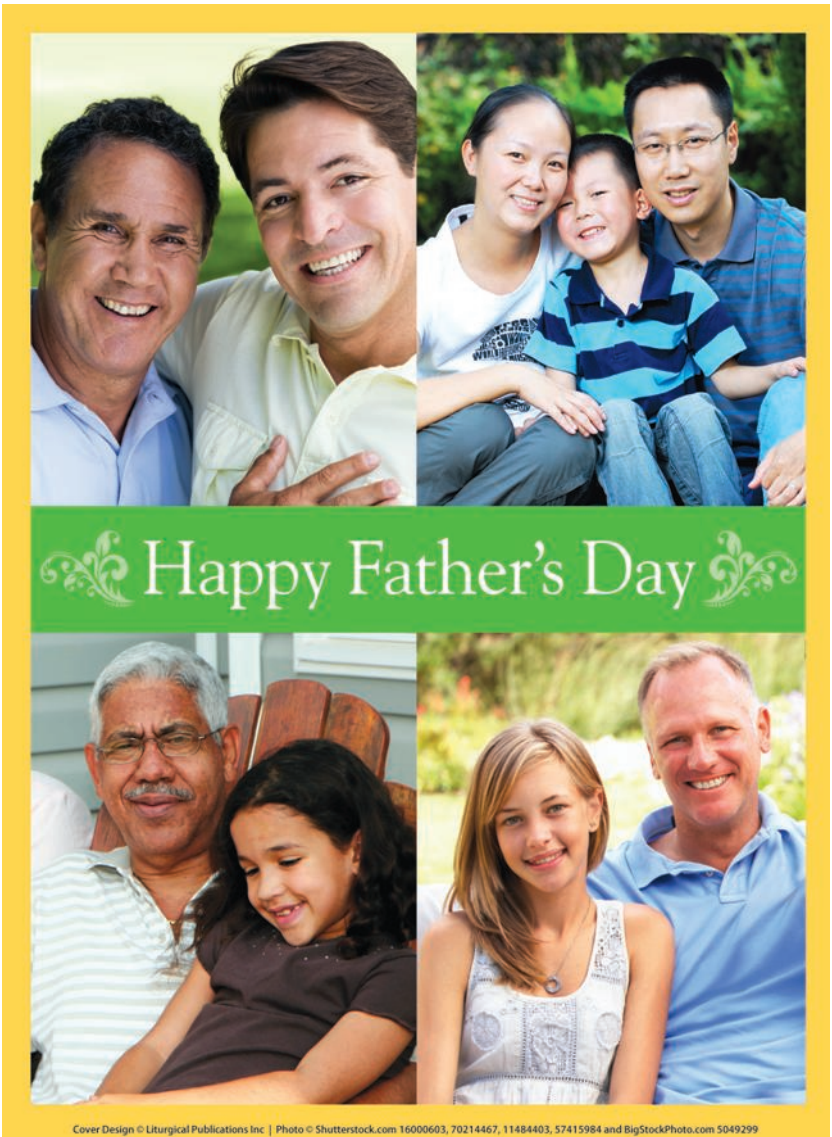
