## From the Desk of the Parish Director

There are two upcoming projects that will affect our parish property and our parish community, scheduled for implementation in the next several months. The first is the Zoo Interchange Project, which I will address in this week's column. The second is the American Transmission Company's installation of electrical poles on 95th St. (see article in today's bulletin), which I will address in next week's column.)

In Spring 2011, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation moved ahead with its preferred alternative for the expansion of the freeway system. This plan includes acquisition of part of our property to the west of the church, an estimate of 100 yards of green space. An environmental and engineering analysis has been conducted. Next, the real estate and utility issues will be addressed. Improvements to adjacent roadways are scheduled for 2013-2014, and the actual reconstruction of the freeway exchange will take place in 2015-2018.

There have been several open meetings for interested persons and stakeholders. Information can be accessed through the website [www.zooic.org](http://www.zooic.org) or by calling the study hot line at (262) 548-6421. You may email any concerns or comments to [dotdtsezoo@dot.wi.gov](mailto:dotdtsezoo@dot.wi.gov). William Mohr, PE is the contact for the project.

In April, the parish trustees, Jeff Roemer, and I sent a letter on behalf of the parish to Bill Mohr of the DOT outlining our concerns regarding the impact to St. Therese Parish. We expressed that the drainage for all the improvements flow towards the freeway instead of towards our church. In addition we addressed our concern regarding the

proposed loss of parking spaces along Bluemound Rd. We also reminded the DOT that today's location of the parish (95th and Bluemound) was the product of a decision made after an earlier acquisition of land.

Jeff Roemer, parish member and civil engineer, has agreed to be our parish consultant regarding the Zoo Interchange Project and the upcoming negotiations for the acquisition (sale) of our land. Our Parish Council and Finance/Administration Committee will be involved in this project as it goes forward. From the beginning of the project study in 2007 until now, the project has changed, and the impact to our parish has likewise changed.

We have also been in close communication with our neighbor, Milwaukee Montessori School, because their property and ministry will also be affected by the proposed Zoo Interchange Project.

If you have any questions or concerns, please contact the DOT, one of our Parish Council members, Jeff Roemer, or our parish trustees. Please keep this project in your prayers, as it does affect the ministries of our parish and of our neighbors, Milwaukee Montessori School.

In our fifty-five year history at 95th and Bluemound, there have been several major challenges that our faith community has faced with strength, courage, and hope. Dealing with the Zoo Interchange Project is another challenge we will face similarly!

## Parish Leadership Meeting with the American Transmission Company Regarding Installation of Electrical Poles on 95th Street

On August 4th, members of the Parish Council, Staff, and parish members who live along 95th St, attended a presentation given by representatives of the American Transmission Company (ATC)—Mary Carpenter, Peter Holtz, and Bill Aeschbacher—regarding the proposed planned installation and erection of electrical poles along 95th St. Increased electrical power is needed for the hospital complexes and country grounds. At this point, there are two proposed routes for one line, and the one which would affect our parish the most is the 95th St alternative.

While our parish leadership realizes the need for increased electrical power to the north of our property (county grounds, hospitals, etc.), we also expressed that we would want the Public Service Commission (the group that makes the final decision regarding routing) to know that we support **underground lines** rather than overhead lines along our property and the Milwaukee Montessori School property. Currently the design for 95th St shows overhead lines.

There will be an Open House to view the final route alternatives on Monday, September 12th from 4:00PM to 7:00PM at the Wauwatosa Civic Center; 7725 W. North Ave., Wauwatosa. Members of our parish community are urged to attend. Information distributed at the August 4th meeting is available by request in the Parish Office during office hours.

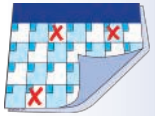

## Important Neighborhood Meeting Regarding American Transmission Project with 10th District Alderman Michael J. Murphy

Alderman Michael J. Murphy will be hosting a neighborhood meeting on Monday, August 29th at 7:00PM to discuss the American Transmission Company (ATC) project which proposes to erect two electrical poles along 95th St. properties. The meeting will be held at Wisconsin Lutheran College, 8800 W. Bluemound Rd., in the Siebert Center which is on the B level of the Recreation Complex. The complex is most easily entered from the parking lot on Wisconsin Avenue. There will be directional signs posted by the college to make it easy to find.

In attendance at the neighborhood meeting will be representatives from ATC and WE Energies who will provide a short presentation and be available to answer your questions as well as address your concerns. Also in attendance will be representatives from the Milwaukee Montessori School.

## Segment 9: The Work of Participation

Full participation at Mass is an act of faith in Jesus Christ. We believe Christ is present in the consecrated Bread and Wine, the Word proclaimed to us, the person of the presider and the gathered assembly. We express our belief not just in the creed, but also in the ways we take part.

- ♦ Our new translation of the *Roman Missal* reflects more closely the official Latin text and uses classical expressions and ways of speech, as well as quotations from Scripture and great Christian teachers. Learning the new translation will help us participate better.
- ♦ The gestures at Mass embody our participation.
- ♦ Keep in mind some basic principles. You will hear: a more literal translation of Latin, with its unique style of expression; a more poetic, more formal kind of English; phrases which more closely convey the Scripture passages behind the prayer and some complex theological terms.

- ♦ Share a time when a particular celebration of the Mass moved you to deeper faith.
- ♦ Why is it important that we have an attitude of togetherness as we celebrate Mass?
