From the Desk of the Parish Director

Thanks to the members of the Parish Council for planning all aspects of the dinner and meeting. Thanks also to Rick Reinders and sons, Noah and Dashiell for special assistance in setting up Heck Hall for the event and to the Parish Staff members for their "behind the scenes" work.

John Gritzmacher, Vice-Chair of the Parish Council, will lead the meeting since Chairperson Jim Holmes is out of town. John has served as a very capable vice-chair and representative to the Finance/Administration Committee over the past three years. His term of office as At-Large member concludes in June, and we thank John for sharing his time and talent so generously for the good of our parish.

Agenda items include 1) the election/affirmation of our trustee-treasurer, Jim Balliet, who has agreed to serve for another two-year term; 2) presentation of our 2013-2014 operating budget; 3) review of the committee/group report booklet which summarizes the activities of each group/ committee during the past year; 4) an update on the Zoo Interchange Project by Forward 45; 5) an explanation of the God bless you! decision-making process for the mass schedule decision; 6) a short presentation on the catechetical needs of the parish; 7) and update on our air conditioning project, and 8) a

review of our cluster configuration as outlined in the document "Parishes and Pastoral Leadership 2020."

Since we try to keep to a 90 minute meeting, we hope to adjourn the meeting by 7:15PM and ask all who a able to help with clean up and take down of the chairs and tables. With all of us (who can) helping, the clean up process will be swift and enjoyable!

The State of Wisconsin requires every corporation to conduct an annual meeting. By doing so, we not only fulfill this requirement, but also conduct the major "business portion" of the parish.

If you have never been to an annual meeting, I urge you to attend. There will be time for parish members to raise questions and concerns. What Would It Take to Rebuild our Christian Formation Ministry and Replenish Our Reserves?

We have achieved a balanced budget for 2013-2014, but we removed \$30,000 that we had earmarked for Christian Formation. We will continue to rebuild our program and ministry with volunteers and stipended coordinators for sacramental preparation and youth ministry. Thanks to all who have increased their stewardship commitments for 2013 -2014. Now we need to work on raising an additional \$120,000. Will you take another step in stewardship? \$5 to \$9 per week per giver would result in our accomplishing all our financial goals for 2013-2014.
