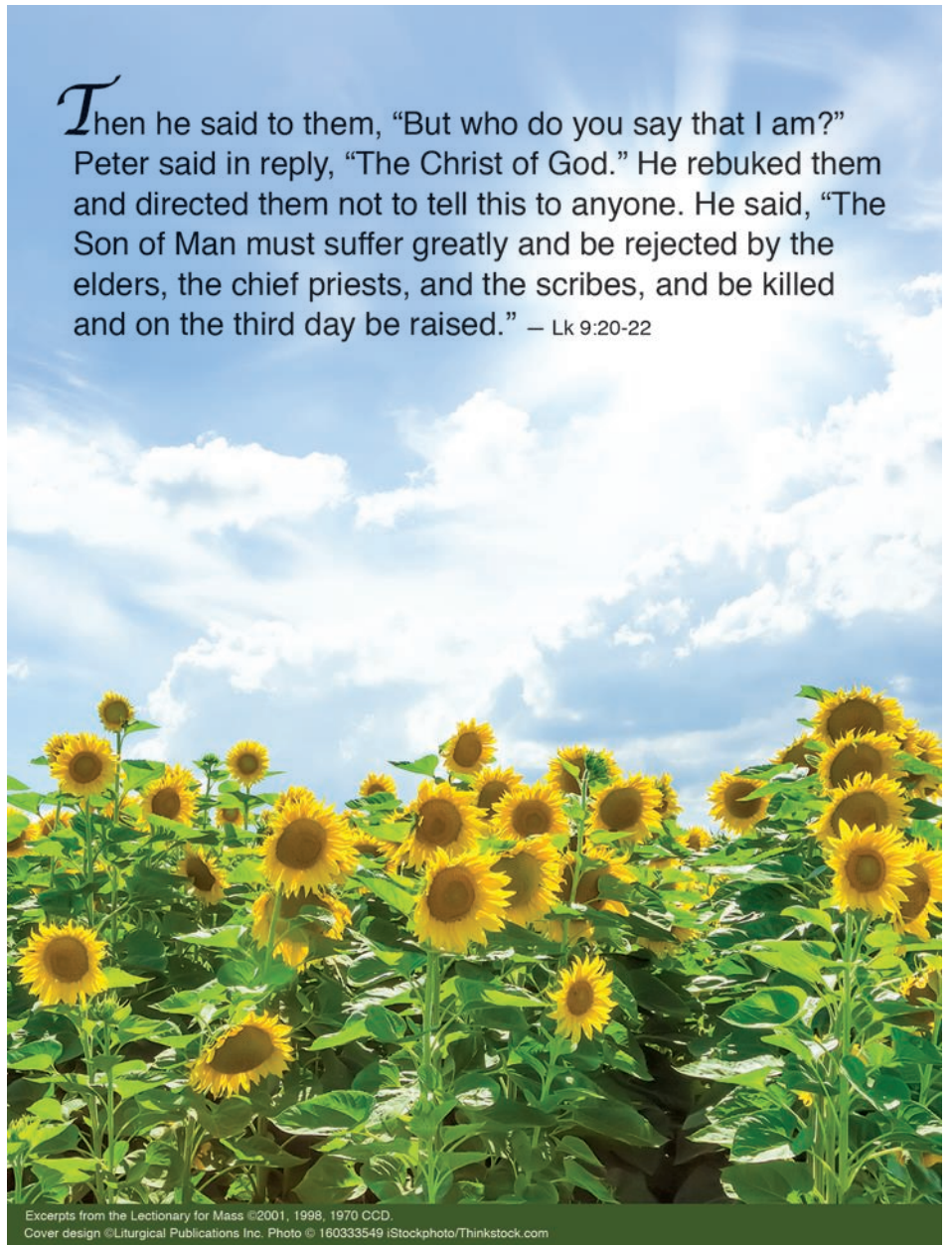

From the Desk of the Parish Director

- As I explained last week, Archbishop ListECKi has mandated that every parish in the archdiocese adopt the Parish Council Norms and Finance Council Norms and create an Appendix on specific operating procedures for each of these. The new Parish Pastoral Council Norms call for the following standing committees or commissions: Prayer and Worship, Christian Formation, Human Concerns, Stewardship, and if there is a school, a School Committee.

Please note that the Finance Council is not a standing committee of the Parish Pastoral Council; instead, it is a free-standing Council.

The relationship between the Parish Pastoral Council and Finance Council is described as follows from the Pastoral Council Norms:

Article 9.1 *One of the Finance Council representatives from the Pastoral Council provides an update on activity to the Pastoral Council at its regular meetings.*

Article 9.2 *The Pastoral Council, in conjunction with its standing commissions / committees, submits an annual parish budget for ministries and operations to the Finance Council for review and recommendation.*

Article 9.3 *The Finance Council collaborates with the standing commissions / committees of the Pastoral Council in its gathering of information and communication on financial matters. The Council may request a committee chairperson or a staff members to prepare a study or to attend a meeting as a resource.*

While the Finance Council is no longer a standing committee of the Parish Pastoral Council, it operates closely with that body. In addition, the Finance Council Norms require two at-large members of the Parish Pastoral Council to be members of the Finance Council.

We are blessed here at St. Therese with the leadership of our Parish Pastoral Council and our Finance Council.

Our elected trustees, Jim Balliet, Trustee-Treasurer, and Kathy Hubrich, Trustee-Secretary are voting members of both bodies.

Reserved Parking Spaces for Parish Members Placement of Cones

Often we rent our parking lot to Milwaukee Montessori School. However, we reserve the spaces closest to the Lobby Entrance and Chapel Entrance for parish members' access to our offices and chapel, and do not rent these. We mark these "reserved" spaces with cones. We are now placing the cones so that parish members can park between the cones.



On Friday mornings the cones are positioned within the parking spaces because these spaces need to be free for truck access to our garbage and recycling enclosure. Usually the access is needed between 7:00AM and 11:00AM.

Thank you for your cooperation. (Our parking lot rental contributes approximately \$5,000 per year to our operating budget.)

Have Some Advice for Us About Ways to Cool the Church?

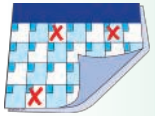

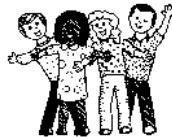

Know the Warning Signs of Abuse

Child molesters look like everyone else. They don't look like scary people that anyone should know to avoid. Rather, they live with their families in our neighborhoods.



One of the most important ways to ensure the safety of children in our environments is to know the warning signs of adults who present a risk of harm to children. Among these signs are when the person (1) always wants to be alone with children in areas where no one can monitor the

interaction, (2) allows children to do things their parents would not permit, (3) is always more excited to be with the children than with adults, and (4) discourages others from participating in activities involving kids.

Archdiocesan Synod Announced: June 7th-8th, 2014

Archbishop Listecki has announced that an Archdiocesan Synod will be held Pentecost weekend, June 7th-8th, 2014. A Synod, simply put, is an assembly where the faithful deliberate on the pastoral needs of the diocese. The Synod will gather people from the entire Catholic community including priests, parish directors, deacons, lay parish leadership, religious communities and parishioners.

The hope of the Synod will be to re-energize Catholics in their faith and inspire a new evangelization within the Church of southeastern Wisconsin. The Synod will provide the faith community the opportunity to develop a renewed vision of how we work together in implementing our pastoral priorities of Catholic Identity, Evangelization and Stewardship.

Archbishop Listecki's recently released Pastoral Letter on the Church, *Who Do You Say That I Am?*, is the foundation from which the Synod planning will occur. Parishes are being asked to hold dialogue sessions in October and November for all parishioners. These sessions will be rooted in the Pastoral Letter and will give parishioners an opportunity to provide input on pastoral goals and future initiatives for the archdiocese.

The Synod and the sessions leading up to it should be a wonderful and exciting spirit-led process that will give the archdiocese a clearer direction of priorities for the next 10 years.
