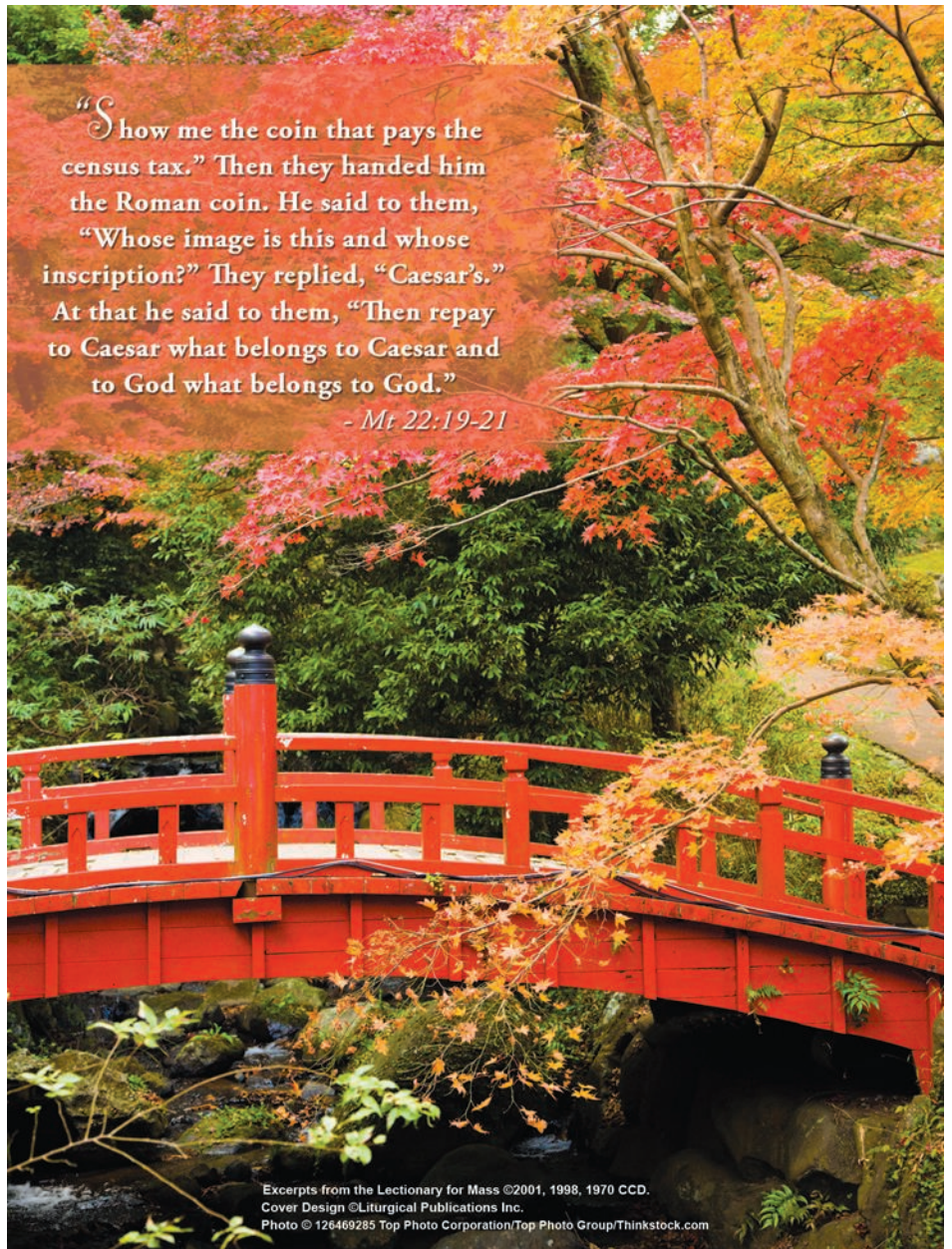

From the Desk of the Parish Director

• We begin our Stewardship Commitment this weekend! Thanks to Jim Balliet, Trustee-Treasurer and Chairperson of our Stewardship Committee and the Stewardship Committee for preparing the stewardship packets for our parish membership. Members of our Stewardship Committee are Jim Balliet, Chairperson; Jim Holmes, Vice-Chairperson; Kathy Sincere, Secretary; Pat Touchett; Linda Okhulica; Cathy Bleidorn; Tim Graf; Joel Simpson; and Lisa Vallone, Bookkeeper. Thanks to outgoing member, Chris Ody for his ministry on the committee for the past year.

There are many opportunities to give your time and talent in ministry listed in our Ministry Booklet. Take a step in faith in your financial giving. A giving guide is also included. - The Bluemound Bridge is down! And the construction continues! Just a reminder that the Ride Share Board is in the Chapel hallway for anyone needing a ride to church or willing to give a ride.
- With the construction comes noise and dust. Most of the

“noise” is during the weekdays, but not the dust. We are anticipating needing to keep our windows closed through next spring, summer, and fall, so our goal is to have air conditioning in our worship space installed by June 2015.

The Building and Grounds Committee will be meeting in November to decide on how to go forward with the air conditioning project. We have been advised that installing mini-slips are no longer allowed in our building due to the building code. While we did explore being “grandfathered in” the old code, that was not approved. Therefore, we will be going forward with traditional air-conditioning. We are in the process of obtaining bids for “traditional” air conditioning. After the Building and Grounds Committee reviews the bids and makes their recommendation to the Finance Council, the parish membership will be informed of our next steps.

You will note that currently we have approximately \$30,000 in our Air Conditioning Fund.

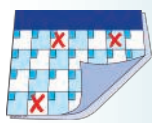

Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time – October 18th/19th
